reciron speciazies in wood burning sculpture and using unusual burl woods. He uses no paint, stain, or glass eyes for the animals he carves. He procures his materials during his weekly beach walks to clear the beach of plastics and other trash. He walks from the Silt-coos outlet to the jetty.

"The wood I find for my projects is my reward," he explains.



Heffron has been carving wood professionally for more than 40 years. He is self-taught and makes his own tools for his unique style, and plans to offer new carving and sculpting classes, in wood and stone, soon.

"I've been to 26 countries and every state in the U.S. I love it here," he says. "I want to put Florence on the international map as an art mecca and to expand the impact and influence of the art community in the north end of town," he says.

"Heffy is working to make a difference for Florence and the Chamber," says Hannigan.

The artist exudes enthusiasm for the chamber and believes it to be a driving force for good in the business and artisan communities.

Heffron opened Heffy's Gallery on July 4, 2018, at 1856 37th St., behind Linda's Thrift Shop at 37th Street and Highway 101. The 1,000-plus square-foot shop features about 170 pieces of Heffron's work, including a carving of a golden eagle with an eight-foot wingspan. The gallery is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily.
